Since 1909, Oak Lawn Park has been an annual event. In 1936 it was renamed Robert E. Lee Park and today it serves as a popular Dallas destination.

Dallas Symphony Orchestra

The Dallas Symphony Orchestra is one of America's longest-standing and highly acclaimed organizations. Led by Music Director Fabio Luisi and President & CEO Kim Noltemy, they have made waves in Dallas' arts community with new initiatives like Young Musicians education and Women in Classical Music program.

The Dallas Symphony Orchestra can trace its beginnings back to Hans Kreissig's 1900 concert, which marked the organization's professional status. At that time, it served as a major source of income for the city as it played to audiences of tens of thousands each night.

After a period of foundering, the Dallas Symphony Orchestra was revitalized in 1911 with the

appointment of Walter J. Fried as concertmaster. He doubled their size and organized them as a professional symphony orchestra.

The Pooch Parade

One of the most beloved events on the spring calendar is the Pooch Parade. Four-legged friends and their owners decked out in Easter best are invited to march down Turtle Creek Boulevard, with winners chosen by a panel of celebrity judges.

This event is free and open to the public; registration takes place in the park gazebo at 9:30 am. Costume contests, music, food trucks and more await participants as they cheer their canine companions as they make their way down the road.

It's essential to ensure the Easter Egg Hunt is secure for all participants, so select an area where you can clearly define boundaries and hide eggs according to age groups. For little ones, place some on the open lawn; for older children and adults, hide some behind mailboxes or plant beds.

Another good strategy is to divide the kids into teams and have each team go find an egg. When they return, tag the next member of their team so they can continue searching for more eggs.
